

Botanical name: Cornus florida (KOR-nus FLOR-ih-duh) Common Name(s): Flowering Dogwood Height: 30' Form, Branches, Twigs: Spreading. Nearly horizontal branches. Rough dark reddish brown bark w/ small square plates. Green or reddish slender twigs becoming almost hairless. Fruit/Seed: White (Spring) flower. Red berries. Opposite leaves, green and nearly hairless above, paler and fine hair below. Leaves: Red in Fall. 2 ½" -5" by 1 ½"-2 ½" wide, slightly wavy (toothed under a lens) slightly wavy with 6-7 curved veins on each side of midvein **Habitat:** Moist nutrient dense soil. Needs some shade! This is an under canopy tree.
