



Botanical Name: Ginkgo biloba L. (GINK go bi LO ba) Common Name(s): Maidenhair tree Height: 50'-70' x same when mature Form, Branches, Twigs: Dioecious pyramidal in youth, spreading when mature. Twigs are hairless light green to light brown, long, stout with many spurs. Gray bark that becomes rough and furrowed as it ages Fruit/Seeds: Male pollen cones 3/4" Female Seeds 1" long (no fruits or flowers) Fan shaped with parallel veins, 3-5 leaves in a cluster on spurs or alternate 1-2" Leaves: long by 1.5"-3" wide, slightly wavy on broad end/often two lobed, long petiole Habitat: Native of China but planted on Pacific Coast and Eastern United States. Likes well drained but adaptable to different soils. Pest, pollution and drought resistant Notes
