



**Botanical Name:** *Ginkgo biloba* L. (GINK go bi LO ba)

**Common Name(s):** Maidenhair tree

**Height:** 50'-70' x same when mature

**Form, Branches, Twigs:** Dioecious pyramidal in youth, spreading when mature. Twigs are hairless light green to light brown, long, stout with many spurs. Gray bark that becomes rough and furrowed as it ages

**Fruit/Seeds:** Male pollen cones 3/4" Female Seeds 1" long (no fruits or flowers)

**Leaves:** Fan shaped with parallel veins, 3-5 leaves in a cluster on spurs or alternate 1-2" long by 1.5"-3" wide, slightly wavy on broad end/**often two lobed**, long petiole

**Habitat:** Native of China but planted on Pacific Coast and Eastern United States. Likes well drained but adaptable to different soils. Pest, pollution and drought resistant
