

Botanical Name: Carya ovate (Mill.)K. Koch (KAIR ee uh oh VAY tuh) Common Name(s): Shagbark Hickory, Scalybark 70' -100' Height: Form, branches, twigs: Narrow irregular crown with tall trunk. Long curved bark strips attached in the middle. Sturdy brown twigs ending in big hairy brown bud. Fruit/Seed: Male-slender drooping catkins (3 hanging from one stalk). Female flowers (2-5) at the tip of same twig. The 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ "-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " fruit is nearly round (flattened at the tip). Dark brown or black thick husk. Edible hickory nut is round or elliptical, slightly flattened and light brown. Greenish-yellow 8"-14"long stemmed compound leaves with 5-7 elliptical or . Leaves: oval leaflets. Fall color: gold **Habitat:** Moist soils, drought resistant
