

Botanical Name: Quercus shumardii (KWERK -us shoo-MAR-dee-eye) Common Name(s): Shumard Oak, Spotted Oak, Swamp Oak 60' to 90' Height: Form, branches, twigs Oval or round open crown. Gray smooth bark that becomes darker gray and slightly furrowed into ridges Acorns 5/8" - 1 1/8" long with a shallow cap with tightly overlapping Fruit/Seed: blunt scales Deeply lobed (nearly to mid-vein) into 5-9 (3"-7"by 2 ½"-5") lobes. Leaves: Elliptical-almost shiny dark green, hairy above, slightly shiny or dull green below with tufts of hairs in vein angles. Fall colors: red or brown **Habitat:** Full sun, drought tolerant, moist well-drained loamy soil, tolerates flood plain but not flooding, dry ridges and limestone hills.
