Common Name(s):	White Oak
Height:	80' -100'
Form, branches, twigs:	Rounded crown. Light gray bark with shallowly fissured into long broad often loose scaly plates/ridges. Wide spreading branches.
Fruit/Seed:	Acorns 3/8" to 1 1/8" with a shallow cap
Leaves:	Elliptical leaf (4"-9" by 2"-4") with 5-9 lobes. Bright green above, whitish. gray-green below. Fall colors: red or brown
Habitat:	Prefers well-drained uplands and lowlands
